



## Louis C. Restivo

April 29, 1923 - February 21, 2010

Louis C. Restivo, of Columbus passed away on Sunday, February 21, 2010 at Virtua Memorial Hospital in Mt. Holly. He was 86. Born and raised in New York, NY, he entered the US Army as soon as he was of age. At the end of the war he came home to marry his beloved wife, Margaret and moved to Palisades Park, NJ, where they lived for over 38 years, before moving to Columbus.

Louis became an ordained Catholic Deacon in Newark, NJ in 1991 where he then served at St. Michaels Church in Palisades Park. When he and his wife moved to Columbus he then became a member and Deacon at Sacred Heart Church in Mt. Holly where he spent much time traveling to council prisoners as well as the sick in area hospitals.
