Margaret H. "Hurffie" Toudy of Lumberton passed away Thursday, November 14, 2013 at Samaritan Inpatient Hospice in Mt. Holly. She was 92. She was a proud 1939 graduate of Woodrow Wilson HS in Camden where she had met her late husband, Alfred and soon became known as the "Romeo and Juliet" of the school. Her connection to the school continued on as she and seven of her friends would make it a point to get together as the "Girls Club" every month after graduation until her passing.

Margaret was also very dedicated to raising her children and their activities, having been Past President of the Christ the King PTA and St. Mary of Angels Academy PTA, leader of the Christ the King Girl Scout Troop, and President of the Christ the King Bowling League. When she was able to find time for herself, she had also been a member of the Riverton Country Club and regularly played in the ladies 9-Hole Leagues.

Wife of the late Alfred J. Toudy; mother of the late James Toudy; she is survived by her two daughters, Margaret Toudy Stuart (James), Judy Meli (Wayne); ten grandchildren; and eleven great-grandchildren.
