“ I am writing on behalf of Mark's longtime friend, John J. Dinella, who wishes the family to know just what a good person he was. John just spoke with Mark a couple of weeks ago and sensed that Mark's time was near. They shared fond memories and funny stories of which I will share one here.

Mark was hired to enclose the bottom of John's front porch at what was then his Father's house on Penn Ave. in Collingswood. Mark was to remove the slat boards, which he did, and to build a brick enclosure along with steps. It was a beautifully done job except for little oversight. Once the brick enclosure was complete, they noticed that John's father wine making equipment was stored under the porch and the opening was too small to get it out. I suspect the wine barrels and other equipment are still safely entombed under the porch. It is kind of a unintended time capsule to a simpler time in an Italian immigrants life in South Jersey.

John sends his condolences to the family and misses Mark already. He is making a donation to the American Cancer Society in Mark's honor.
