



## Martin Hauth, III

Martin Hauth III of Mount Holly died Thursday, Dec. 27, 2012 at his residence. He was 88.

Born in Corry, N.Y., Mr. Hauth was a U.S. Navy veteran of World War II.

He was a retired salesman for Frito-Lay in Cinnaminson.
