M. Elizabeth "Betty" Mathis died Monday, April 20, 2009 at the Burlington Woods Conv. Center in Burlington. She was 91.

Born in Pennsauken, NJ, Mrs. Mathis was a longtime Rancocas Resident. She lived in Rancocas for 80 years. Mrs. Mathis was the former Postmaster in Rancocas for 40 years. Along with her husband, the late James Mathis, she owned Stevens General Store and created the Rancocas Coffee Shoppe. She was an active member of the Rancocas Friends Meeting. She also visited and resided in Beach Haven Gardens. With her husband, they raised Great Danes. Mrs. Mathis was also an avid needlepoint enthusiast and loved gardening.

She is survived by her son and daughter-in-law Steven and Andrea Mathis of Rancocas, a grandson Owen Phillip Mathis. She was the sister of the late W. Marshall Stevens.

Funeral services will be held on Saturday at 11:00 at the Rancocas Friends Meeting, Main Street, Rancocas. Interment will be in the Rancocas Friends Cemetery.
