May 7, 1920 - July 12, 2013

Mary Frances (Ebbets) Krepacki, a long time resident of Mt. Holly, passed away quietly on Friday morning, July 12th, at the age of 93 in Oviedo, FL. Mary was a joy and inspiration to the residents and staff of Emeritus Senior Living in Oviedo, often leading everyone in song through her angelic singing voice. Born in Brooklyn, NY in May 1920, Mary was a volunteer with the USO during and after WWII. It was there she met her husband, Spec 4 Lech V. Krepacki, a soldier with the US Army. After Mr. Krepacki was stationed to Heidelberg, Germany, Mary set sail on the SS United States for Europe. She and Lech married in May, 1955 in Heidelberg. Mary is survived by her loving son and daughter, Victor Alan and Wanda Anne, one grandson, Alexander Bruce, and numerous nieces and nephews (Mary was the youngest of 7 children).
