Neal Gsell Troth of Little Egg Harbor, passed away, Saturday, April 25, 2015 at Arcadia Nursing and Rehab LTC in Little Egg Harbor. He was 87.

Born in Mount Holly, Mr. Troth was a graduate of Rancocas Valley Regional High School, where he met his future wife, June, as a freshman. He was named best all-around athlete as a senior. He and his father were the first father and son to receive this honor. Mr. Troth was also a member of the Rancocas Valley Sports Hall of Fame. After graduation, he served our country in the Navy serving in the Pacific during World War II. Mr. Troth was in Tokyo Harbor to witness General McArthur signing the Japanese surrender. He served on a LCT under his skipper, Ensign Charles Merrium (ret.). After his honorable discharge from the US Navy he and June married, a union that lasted 62 years until her passing. Mr. Troth was in the building and hardware business employed as a longtime Manager for the Cranmer Lumber Co. and ending his career as a sales representative for Tuckerton Lumber Co.

The husband of the late June; he is survived by his daughter, Sally J. Troth of Neptune and many extended family members.
