Norman A. Bakely, 87, of Vincentown passed away on November 11, 2020. "Alan", as he was affectionately referred to, was born in Vincentown, and has been a lifelong resident.

He retired from the United States Air Force in 1974, and then went to work at Dow Chemical before coming to McGuire Air Force Base. He retired from the base in the early 90's. Alan was a Mason, and was also a member of the Vincentown Historical Society, and the Tabernacle Church of Christ. He started his own trucking company in the 80's. He was a hard-working man who started working at the age of 7. He worked right up to the day of his passing.
