Patricia A. McDonald, of Lumberton, NJ passed away Saturday, May 3, 2014 at Samaritan Inpatient Hospice in Mt. Holly, NJ. She was 66. A longtime Lumberton resident, she was a graduate of Emmanuel College in Boston and had retired after a distinguished 33 year teaching career in Pemberton Township, NJ.

Her influence extended well beyond the classroom. In Pemberton Township she was considered a fearless teacher leader and a gracious mentor to other educators. She was most proud of her lasting influence on the 7th and 8th graders that passed through her classrooms.
