Robert J. Byer, Sr of Mount Holly, passed away on Thursday, January 2, 2025 at Virtua-Memorial Hospital in Mount Holly. He was 84.

Born in Mount Holly, the son of the late Howard and Sarah Elizabeth Byer, Bob was a graduate of Rancocas Valley Regional High School and served in the Army National Guard. He later went on to run the family business, Byer Lock.

Mr. Byer was very involved in the local community, he was an honorary member of the Moose and a member of the Mount Holly Elks, the VFW Post 2692 and F&AM #14.
