Robert C. Ezze of Mount Holly passed away, Tuesday, September 30, 2014 at the Samaritan Hospice Inpatient Unit in Mount Holly. He was 83.

The son of the late Joseph & Josephine S. Ezze, Mr. Ezze was born in Mount Holly and was a lifelong resident. He served in the US Navy during Korea and after his discharge worked as a Mailman in Mount Holly for 33 years. He also worked as Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds for Burlington County for 25 years. Mr. Ezze was a member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church and served as a usher and a member of the Men's Prayer Breakfast group at the Church. He was a member of the Mt. Holly VFW Post #2692 and the Mt. Holly Elks Lodge #848. Bob enjoyed traveling to Florida and Disney, vacationing on LBI, and he was an avid Notre Dame fan and loved traveling to games. He was also the number one fan of his granddaughters' sports and dancing events.
