Robert H. Gaskill, a lifelong resident of Mount Holly, passed away on Saturday, July 7, 2018 at his home surrounded by his family. He was 85. He was born on July 7, 1933 in Mount Holly; the son of the late Ralph, Sr. and Zaida (nee Homm) Gaskill.

He was a graduate of Rancocas Valley Regional High School. During high school, he played basketball and was a pitcher on the baseball team. He retired as a postmaster after 30 years with the US Postal Service. He was the president of the Postmasters of Burlington County. He was an avid golfer and was a member of the Burlington Country Club for many years. He was a beloved Mount Holly Little League coach and a longtime member of First Baptist Church of Mt. Holly.

He is survived by his wife of 61 years Elaine (nee Bird); sons, Robert and his wife Susan, and David; grandchildren, Tyler (Kate), Anna, David, Jr., and Adam. He is predeceased by his brother Ralph Gaskill, Jr. and his sister, Nancy Erisman.
