Robert A Richardson of Cinnaminson, NJ passed away unexpectedly on January 31, 2025 at the age of 89. Robert, or Bob as his friends knew him, was born in Nashua, NH on May 21, 1935. In 1952, when he was just 17, Bob joined the U.S. Navy and served 10 years during the Korean War. He returned to civilian life in 1962. On July 27, 1957 he married his sweetheart, Marjorie Lee Caron and shared 65 years together until her passing in February 2023. They spent the majority of their lives in Londonderry, NH where Bob tried his hand at self-employment as a locksmith and then settled into full time employment at the then new Anheuser-Bush plant as a Utility Plant Engineer. engaged in many of their programs, especially Rummikub. He was very inquisitive, enjoyed meeting new people, had a love for games, puzzles, reading and spending time with family, friends and neighbors. He could strike up a conversation with anyone he came across.

He is predeceased by his wife Marjorie and son Ryan and survived by his sons; Gary and daughter-in-law Sheryl; son Barry and daughter-in-law Claire; son Gregg and daughter-in-law Julia; his grandchildren Heather, Nicole, Derek, Jake, Nicholas, Emma, Ian, and Matthew; and five great grandchildren.
