Robert B. Morris of Southampton, formerly of Mount Holly, died Thursday, March 12, 2009 at Virtua-Memorial Hospital in Mount Holly. He was 74. Born in Allentown, NJ, Mr. Morris was a longtime Mount Holly resident. He moved to Leisuretown in Southampton about a year ago. He was a graduate of Allentown High School and a US Navy Veteran of Korea. Mr. Morris worked as a truck driver for Bair Transport along with his brother Stuart, and later worked as a Service Manager for Wilfred MacDonald Turf Equipment. He was a longtime member of the Mt. Holly Moose and a member of the US Coast Guard Auxiliary. Mr. Morris loved boating & fishing and he enjoyed NASCAR racing.

The husband of the late Lesley, Robert is survived by his 4 children: 3 sons James R. Morris (Maria A.) of Barnegat; Stephen J. Morris (Pamela A.) of Lumberton; Eric W.
