She graduated from North Plainfield High School in 1965 and went on to attend East Stroudsburg State College in Pennsylvania, earning her BS in Education in 1969.

On July 10, 1971, Roz married Carl Ericson, and in 1974, they settled in Eastampton, NJ. She spent ten years as a stay-at-home mother and homemaker before returning to teach high school sciences in Moorestown, NJ, in 1984. In 1986, Roz and Carl purchased their current home and property in Eastampton, where she devoted considerable time to beautifying the premises.

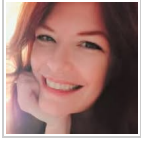
