Her father was in the Army and was stationed in Germany and several locations in the United States before they retired to Texas.

She met, fell in love, and married then CPT Michael L. Warner in the chapel on Fort Hood, Texas on November 6, 1969. She took on the rewarding role of an Army wife and mother beautifully. In their military career Mike and June were stationed at various posts in the United States and completed a six-year tour in Germany. She was also a long time employee of the Armed Forces Exchange Service working as an Estee Lauder representative and served in a multitude of roles in several Officers' Wives Clubs throughout the years. Their last posting was at Fort Dix, New Jersey where Michael retired as a colonel.
