



Ruth G Pinkerton

December 28, 1918 - October 28, 2015

Ruth W. Pinkerton died on Wednesday, October 28, 2015 at the Samaritan Hospice Inpatient Unit in Mount Holly. She was 96 years old. Ruth was the youngest of four children born to Rose Ella and Bradley Packard Green and grew up on her family's farm near Winsted, Connecticut. Upon graduation from the Waterbury Hospital School of Nursing, she traveled to northern Newfoundland to work at the Wilfred Grenfell Mission Hospital. From 1942 until the end of World War II, Ruth served as a nurse with the US Army in New Zealand, New Caledonia and Saipan. There was a pharmacist at the hospital in New Zealand named Claude P. Pinkerton whom she married several days after he returned to the States from the War. They spent most of their married life in Mount Holly where Ruth was a school nurse for many years. She graduated with a B.A. from Trenton State College in 1965.

Ruth's husband Claude died in 1979. She is survived by her daughter Nancy (Jim) Hutchins and by her son Philip (Janice) Pinkerton; 5 grandchildren: Julia (David) Hutchins, Gregory Hutchins, Anna (Nathan) Robison, Kari (Trey) Rider and Adam Pinkerton; and 6 great-grandchildren.

Funeral Services will be held on Wednesday at 11:00 AM at the Perinchief Chapels, 438 High St., Mount Holly. Interment will follow in the Mount Holly Cemetery. Friends may visit with the family on Wednesday from 10-11 AM at the Funeral Home.
