Stanley G. Cliver of Springfield Township, beloved father, grandfather, great-grandfather and friend to many, passed away peacefully on Thursday, October 13, 2016. He was 100.

Stanley was born in Mount Holly and was a lifelong area resident. He and his late wife of 64 years, Anne Estelle (nee Brown), operated a large dairy farm of North Pemberton Road in Eastampton. After retiring from dairy farming, Stanley did survey work for the County Board of Agriculture and worked for the Burlington County Library. He served on both the Eastampton and Rancocas Valley Regional High School School Boards of Education. He was a longtime member and elder at the First Presbyterian Church in Mount Holly, and was a longtime member of the Springfield Township Historical Society.

The wife of the late Anne, he is survived by his three children: Jeffrey George Cliver and his wife Royce of Las Vegas, NV, Judith Wolfrom and her husband Glenn of Pemberton, and Gerald James Cliver and his wife Deborah of Highland City, FL; 7 grandchildren, 10 great-grandchildren. Stanley was predeceased by his siblings: Ruth, Lucy, & Albert and is survived by his sister Virginia Detrick.

Funeral Services will be held on Friday at 2 PM at the Perinchief Chapels, 438 High St., Mount Holly. Interment will follow in the Mount Holly Cemetery.
