Even though I was a SSG, Steve took me under his wing and taught me the "important" things I needed to know on how to skate by! Why climb over a mountain when you could drive around it? I recall Steve had got his re-enlistment bonus and him and Peg invited our family over for a Lobster dinner. I had never ate a full lobster before and right away Steve showed me how to crack and eat it, avoiding the bad parts along the way. I can still see that table and dinner. Peg you and Steve sure knew how to cook. One day Steve and his boys and me and my girls went way back in the wilderness and walked about two miles to King salmon fish. We all caught our fish and then Steve and I had to carry them all back to the vehicles. There were many more fishing trips and rabbit hunts that I will cherish until I die. Steve is a friend you only find once in a life time. I recall we all went north to see the glacier and down to Steward to camp and fish. Peg we have a bunch of film and I will try and get it together and make a CD for you. Do you recall the big camera we had that we used filming? I was also a RCMAT Pilot and this was remote controlled aircraft and Steve became the first 11B to earn his pilot license's. Steve was good at everything he did. After we all left Alaska we did not get to see each other very much afterwards but we always knew we were family. Like I said before Steve was a once in a life time friend that you meet along the way. Oh you have many friends but just one was the special one GOD placed in your life! I will miss you old friend, but when JESUS CHRIST died on the Cross and arose again three days later, HE provided a way for all who believed in HIM and what HE did to be forever saved from that place called hell and when JESUS went to Heaven HE said I go to prepare a place for you and that place JESUS has prepared for us is going to be awesome and that is where Steve is living now, waiting for us to join him.
