



Stuart Allerton Murray

October 30, 1935 - January 27, 2018

Stuart Allerton Murray, of Mt. Holly, NJ, beloved husband, father, and grandfather, passed away January 27, 2018 at the age of 82.

Stuart was a graduate of West Orange High School, Lafayette College, and Rutgers University Graduate School of Education. Stuart was an outstanding basketball and baseball player in high school and college and was elected to both the Lafayette College Hall of Fame and West Orange High School Hall of Fame. He led his team in 1957 to a berth in the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament with a 22.1 per game scoring average and was drafted by the Cincinnati Royals in the 1957 NBA Draft.

Stuart had a long career in education as a teacher and coach at Rancocas Valley Regional, Ewing, and Shawnee High Schools. He was the head basketball coach at Ewing and Rancocas Valley Regional High Schools.

Stuart was very active in the local community serving as an officer in the Good Intent Volunteer Fire Company, Mt. Holly Lions Club, the Mt. Holly Library and the Mt. Holly Bicentennial Committee. He also was a very active alumnus of Lafayette College and a member of the Lafayette Maroon Club.

He is survived by his loving wife of 53 years, Mary Lou, daughter Susan Murray of Burlington, NJ and son Douglas Murray (Kara) of Bryn Mawr, PA, in

addition to his grandchildren Jake and Logan Gongora and Frances, James, and Genevieve Murray; as well as his brother Norman (Hap) Murray of Easton, PA.

Funeral Services will be held on Saturday at 11:00am at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, 121 High St., Mount Holly. Relatives and friends are invited to his visitation on Friday evening from 6-8pm at the Perinchief Chapels, 438 High St., Mount Holly. Burial will be in the Mount Holly Cemetery.

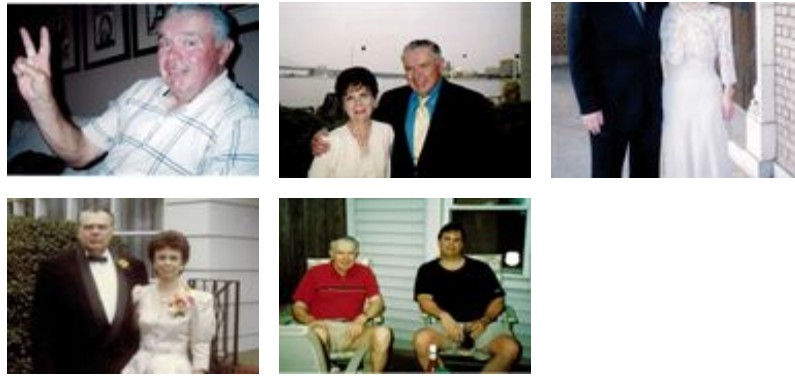
