Susan Hoegel Jorgensen of Hainesport passed away on Wednesday, March 20, 2013 at Jefferson Neuroscience Hospital in Philadelphia. Susan was 41.

Born in Camden, New Jersey, Susan grew up in Cherry Hill and was a graduate of Cherry Hill High School East. She attended Lycoming College and graduated in 1994 with a degree in Psychology/Elementary Education. During her college years, Susan was an active member of Alpha Sigma Tau sorority and played on the college softball team. Working as an aide with the children at Bancroft School for several years after graduation inspired Susan to seek her special education degree which she earned from Rowan University. Susan taught at Stone Mountain Middle School in Atlanta, Georgia for two years before returning to New Jersey and working as a Special Education Teacher in the Gloucester Township Schools at both the Glen Landing and Ann E. Mullen Middle Schools. She was a member of NJEA and was active in various school activities.

Susan is survived by her husband, Donald J.
