In earlier years, she played the French Horn in the Philadelphia Symphony Orchestra. Mrs. Grovatt was also a well know Cake maker and decorator. She taught sign language for Eastern Baptist College, had taught Sunday School at Calvary Bible Church, was a member of the Parents' Advisory Board of the Burlington County Special Services School and was a former President of the Westampton PTA. The mother of the late Alan, Mrs. Grovatt is survived by her husband Nelson; 2 sons and their wives: Larry and Denise Grovatt of Gibbstown; Wayne and Lynda Grovatt of Burlington Township; and 4 grandchildren: Travis, Kaitlin, Tyler, and Trevor.
