Thomas G. Faile of Burlington Township, formerly of Lumberton, passed away on Monday, July 10, 2017 at Marcella Center in Burlington. He was 66.

Born in Monroe, NC, Tom was a longtime Lumberton resident. He had worked locally for CVS and he was a self-employed entrepreneur. Tom enjoyed traveling, reading and writing. He loved history, especially American Military History, and he had a large library of books. He was also a trustee of the Burlington County Prison Museum. Tom was a member of Our Lady Queen of Peace Church in Hainesport, the Burlington County Right to Life, the Republican National Committee, and a past member of the American Security Council. Tom was a Retired service member of the New Jersey Army National Guard.

The son of the late Anna & Grover Faile, Tom is survived by several 1st cousins: Andrew Glodek of Burlington City and Veronica Stevenson of Bordentown, and Ruby Bailey, Caroline Jacobs, Ernest Deese and Elaine Blackmon all from South Carolina, as well as other relatives and friends.
