Thomas B. Platt, of Southampton, passed away on Monday, February 29, 2016 at Northwest Medical Center in Margate, Florida after a battle with cancer and comforted by family. He was 74. Tom was born in Camden, NJ in 1941. He was the 1st child of the late Thomas and Doris Platt. After graduating from Mt. Holly High School Class of 1959, he served in the U.S. Air Force from 1962 to 1966. Discharged as A1C, he was stationed at Cocoa Beach, FL during the Mercury Space Program. Tom was in installation for Western Electric/Alcatel-Lucent for 30 years doing telecommunications and electronic switching installs.

He was raised in the Clermont section of Hainesport, providing Tom, brother Larry and friend Bob Morgan with a "Tom Sawyer Lifestyle." He enjoyed fishing, hunting, and summers at Utches Marina on his fishing boat the "Fine & Dandy." He never left the dock without family and friends. Fall and winters were spent at Square Circle and Twin City Rod & Gun Club hunting pheasants. Six Labrador retrievers later, Tom called it quits. He also enjoyed traveling and spending his winters in Florida with a good friend Maria.

Tom is survived by his brother Larry and sister-in-law Joyce; nieces, Terry Marinelli and Jennifer Leale and nephew, Lawrence Jr.
