Lt. Col. Thurlow A. "Ted" Pruyne, II of Mount Holly, went to be with the Lord on Monday, April 17, 2017 at Virtua Memorial Hospital in Mount Holly. He was 65. Born in Chicopee, Mass., Ted was a graduate of Rancocas Valley Reg. High School (1969). Ted earned his Eagle Scout award with the Boy Scouts. He completed his undergraduate studies at Davis & Elkins College and later earned his MBA at the University of Michigan. Ted actively served in the US Air Force for 3 years as a transportation officer. The remaining years of his military service was spent in the Air Force Reserves, retiring as a LT Col. Ted furthered his career utilizing his exceptional customer service and sales skills at Cambell's Soup Co and Siemens Corp. He was an avid sports enthusiast and a diehard fan of the Philadelphia Phillies and Eagles. Ted will forever be remembered for his outgoing personality, kind heart and quick-witted sense of humor. 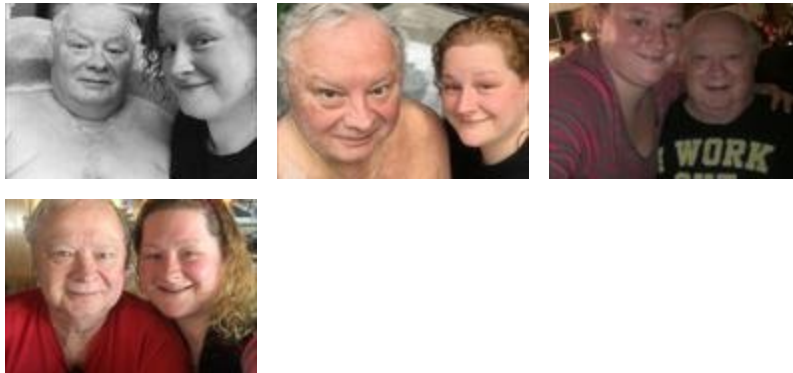
