Walter J. Grzesczuk, of Columbus, passed away on March 3, 2017 at his home surrounded by his family. He was 90. Born in Ridley Park, PA on September 11, 1926 to the late Benjamin and Nettie Grzesczuk. He was married to Gloria, who predeceased him in 2010.

Walter served in the U.S. Army during World War II, the Korean Conflict and Vietnam. He retired as a Command Sergeant Major after 30 years of service. He enjoyed fishing and hunting in Alaska and was a bush pilot. He was an accomplished bowler. In addition, he was a devoted parishioner of Sacred Heart Church. Many of his fellow parishioners were happy recipients of the Benedictine Crucifix necklace that he enjoyed sharing. Last but not least, he was an avid coin dealer/numismatist.

Walter is survived by his children, Mark (Chandra) Grzesczuk, Paul Grzesczuk, Angelica (Steven) Robertson, and Benjamin Grzesczuk; and a beloved grandfather of 6.
